In Process Work we assume that as long as there is breath and pulse, there is also a potential for consciousness and an opportunity for spiritual growth. Like every human being, people in withdrawn states also need contact, relationship, and support in their existential experiences on their inner journey. Process-oriented Coma Work offers methods and approaches to connect with patients in nonverbal states (coma, vegetative state, minimally conscious state, but also severe depression, autism, severe illness, dying processes etc.) and to support communication with, and understanding for, patient's experiences. Process Work offers ways to explore and deepen the awareness of our own altered states of consciousness as basic prerequisite in building relationship with people who are presumed to be unconscious.

This weekend seminar will give an introduction, demonstration, and practical experience in Process-oriented Coma Work.

Peter Ammann - resident in Germany - is a health practitioner who, for 20 years, has specialised in Process Work and craniosacral therapy in his practice. He is a teacher of craniosacral therapy since 1996, gives lectures at conferences, leads workshops and seminars in Process Work in various application areas, especially in the field of coma and vegetative states. Since 1996 he has been a student of psychology (Bochum, Germany) and enrolled as advanced phase-II student in Process Work in the Research Society of Process-Oriented Psychology – starting his training in Zurich and since 2004 in RSPOP U.K. London. For the last four years he has been intensifying his work and studies in Process Oriented Coma Work, a special application area of Process Work. His dissertation in psychology and process-oriented psychology is a quantitative and qualitative research focussing on contact and communication with people in deep altered states of coma in an ICU environment. He is a single parent of two wonderful, grown-up children.
